
Prayer breakfast to remember, reflect on 9/11

on 9/11 when he left his Wilton, Conn. office and drove to the site of the World Trade Center to offer his assistance. Of the few survivors to be rescued from the rubble of the site were police officers Will Jimeno and John McLoughlin – located and helped to rescue by Karnes and another Marine, Jason Thomas. Following the incident, Karnes reenlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve and deployed twice to Iraq during the next 17 months, according to Slate News.

Participants in the 9/11 prayer breakfast will join the Army War College/ Carlisle Barracks Patriot Day Ceremony at 8:30 a.m. at the U.S. flag in front of Root Hall, recognizing both first responders and the men and women of military forces around the globe who have responded in one way or another to the events of 9/11.
