A new date has been set for the Army War College celebration of Native American Heritage in the U.S. Army.

The performance of the Red Blanket Native Pride Dancers has been rescheduled for Dec. 10, at 7 p.m. at the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center at 950 Soldiers Drive, Carlisle, Pa.

The Army will recognize the contributions of Native American Soldiers who have served in the U.S. Army with great honor, dedication and distinction, building a legacy of courage, professionalism and selfless service that will inspire future generations.

The dancers will perform a wide array of ceremonial and social dancing techniques including authentic dress, freestyle movements, and intense music, accompanied by vocals and flutes from the Northern Plains to complete the performance.

The Red Blanket Native Pride Dancers' mission is to "educate, inspire, motivate, and empower diverse communities to bridge cultural gaps through indigenous traditions." Like many other native groups, they are "passionately devoted to keeping traditions alive" through music and dance.
