

Help the library accountability: turn books in, re-check them out

Today, the USAWC Library announced new, improved borrowing policy today, designed to maximize all patrons' access to Library materials.

"Thanks for all the cooperation thus far with our inventory and book returns. The Library still needs your help to get accountability of our Army property," said Greta Braungard, USAWC Library Chief, who is guiding the Library accountability campaign -- and the inspirational Commandant video (see related links).

"If you have materials that are overdue, please bring them back to the Library. You can come down to the circulation desk in the Library-Root Hall to see a list of materials on your account," she explained.

Keep in mind that textbooks, and faculty development books purchased by

the items, are due back to the Library one week prior to the week, and these items must be re-validated on your account each year. Naturally, students will return all textbooks AND Library materials before clearing the Army War College at the end of the academic year.

The new borrowing privileges for Library stacks materials are as follows. Materials can be re-checked after a 24-hour grace period, to allow other patrons the opportunity to check out the material.

- Books and audio-books will check out for 60 days, with no renewals.
- DVDs will check out for 7 days, with no renewals.
- Course reserves items will check out for 3 days or are in-house use only, dependent on availability of materials.
- The limit of Library material checked out at one time is 25 items per patron.
