9/11 Commemoration: 'Tunnel to Towers' 9/11 mobile exhibit at AHEC, Aug 31 10am-6pm

2021 marks the 20th year since the September 11th attacks on New York City, Shanksville, Pa, and the Pentagon.

The U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center will host the Tunnel to Towers (T2T) 9/11 NEVER FORGET Mobile Exhibit is open from 10 am to 6 pm: Tuesday, Aug. 31. The exhibit will be free and open to the public; masks are required.

The Tunnel to Towers Mobile Exhibit is traveling to multiple key locations, including the USAHEC, to vividly bring the events of that day to life. The 1,100 square foot exhibit features World Trade Center Steel, aluminum façade from the buildings, radio transmissions from first responders, and items found in the rubble after the Twin Towers collapsed. Visitors can view photos of the 9/11 Memorial at the Pentagon and the Flight 93 National Memorial.

FDNY firefighter veterans of 9/11 will provide free guided tours through the exhibit, sharing their perspectives and experiences on September 11th and the days that followed.

Concurrently honoring the 9/11 fallen and the sacrifices of veterans since then, T2T Chairman and CEO Frank Siller is walking 500-miles from the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., through six states and Shanksville, PA, ending at Ground Zero in NYC.

"The T2T Foundation honors the sacrifice of firefighter Stephen Siller who laid down his life to save others on September 11, 2001, as well as the military and first responders who continue to make the supreme sacrifice of life and limb for our country."
