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The Army War College is now accepting applications for two significant positions in the Department of Military Strategy, Planning and Operations. Both positions have a close out date of Nov. 11, 2021, are open to the public and can be found on USAJOBS.gov.

These are full-time civilian faculty positions at the U.S. Army War College in DMSPO, as provided under Title 10 USC 4021. Initial appointment may be up to three years, with the first year probationary. The appointment may be renewed in one to five-year increments thereafter. Academic rank and salary will be based on the selectee's academic credentials, experience, and professional accomplishments; however, the focus is at the senior Assistant Professor level.

Responsibilities

- Serve as the Professor of Strategic Landpower in DMSPO and contribute to developing, planning, administering, and teaching core courses in the Resident Education Program and associated programs.
- Lead a faculty team in developing and delivering the Joint Warfighting Advanced Studies Program and other programs focusing on strategic joint warfighting.
- Developing lessons, teaching, and assessing student performance in core and elective courses including, but not limited to, military strategy, campaign design, senior leadership, military history, operational art, and evolving defense concepts.
- Leading a faculty team to develop and deliver a focused program that improves student proficiency at campaign design, strategic joint warfighting, and wargaming.
- Participating in scholarship that advances knowledge in fields of the topics listed above or related topics.
