



Army War College's Dr. Kevin Weddle and British military historian Mr. Andrew Robertshaw provide both nations' perspectives on the impacts of this pivotal battle. In addition to contemporary opinions on the battle, they will also discuss how attitudes toward the battle have changed over time.

Dr. Weddle, author of "The Compleat Victory: Saratoga and the American Revolution," published in 2021, is the Elihu Root Chair of Military Studies and a Professor of Military Theory and Strategy at the Army War College. Dr. Weddle earned his PhD in history from Princeton University and served in the U.S. Army for over 28 years.

Robertshaw is a freelance British military historian, author and broadcaster. He has previously worked as a museum director for the British Ministry of Defense, a lecturer for British infantry soldiers at Catterick, and as a historical consultant on the films "War Horse" and "1917". Robertshaw now leads battlefield tours and lectures at Staff College for the Norwegian and Canadian armed forces.
