Carlisle Barracks, PA - Army War College staff member Luis Mora-Arroyo was awarded the certificate of 50-year service with the United States government by Maj. Gen. David Hill on September 22. Mora-Arroyo, a management analyst at the Army Heritage and Education Center, has been a war college employee since 2002.

“I am extremely proud to be able to serve this great nation, to stay this long, and continue to serve my country in any capacity,” said Mora-Arroyo.

Mora-Arroyo, originally from Hatillo, Puerto Rico, began his military service when he was drafted into the Vietnam War in 1970. He would end up serving in the Army for 30 years and retired as a Command Sergeant Major. He had spent the majority of his service working in electric communications. Mora-Arroyo has served all over the world, ranging from Hawaii to Germany, but ended up choosing Central Pennsylvania to live

after retiring from active duty.

“I love my job and the mission that I serve,” said Mora-Arroyo. “The Army Heritage Education Center has a unique mission in providing the public with the history of the Army, which is something I enjoy doing every day.”

Mora-Arroyo has been awarded the Korea Defense Service Medal, the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, and the Kuwait Liberation Medal.
