## POSTPONED - NEW DATE TBD: Army War College to sponsor forum on Scholarship of Teaching, Learning for Joint PME

This event is suspended for the planned March 31 due to Army and Pennsylvania guidance related to COVID-19. A new date will be announced at a later date.

The first annual Joint Professional Military Education Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (JSOTL) Forum will take place at the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle Pa, March 31, 2020. A call for proposals closed on Feb. 7. Registration for participants closes March 17; register HERE.

The JPME Forum on Scholarship of Teaching and Learning is planned to be a collaborative forum for all who are interested in Professional Military Education. We welcome all PME constituents, said forum coordinator Dr. Megan J. Hennessey, @MegJHennessey, the Army War College Director of Educational Methodology.

Emphasis on collaboration is reflected in the forum structure, the open call for proposals, and the wide range of desired participants. The invitation is open to educators, scholars and practitioners who engage in formalized educational preparation for active duty members of the military, both commissioned and enlisted – ranging from the Marine Corps Tactics and Operations Group to Intermediate Level Education and Senior Service College programs, Hennessey said.

The forum's purpose is to improve student outcomes through inclusive, evidence-based, and collaborative dialogue in plenary sessions and concurrent small-group sessions. Plenary session speaker will be <a href="Dr.Olenda Johnson">Dr.Olenda Johnson</a>, Professor of Strategic Leadership and Leader Development a the U.S. Naval War College. In her primary USNWC role, she develops and facilitates leader development for Flag/General Officers and Senior Executive Service Civilians.

Each participant will have opportunity for collaboration in four breakout sessions, chosen from a rich selection of 43 research topics related to Joint Professional Military Education:
