

Local businesses welcome new students at the county fair

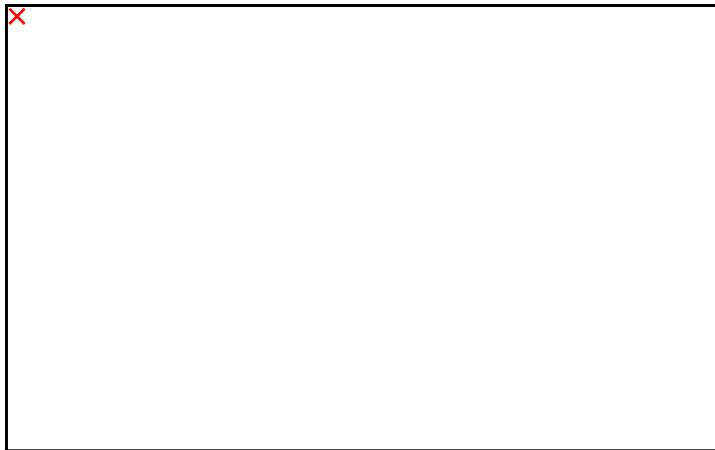
Local businesses welcome new students at the county fair

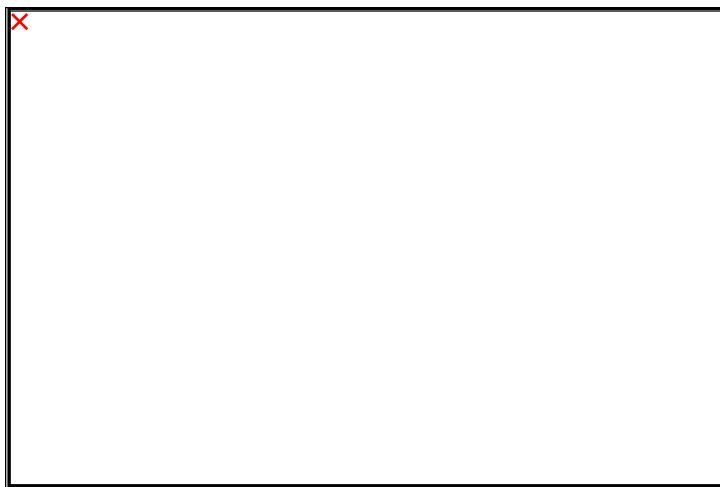
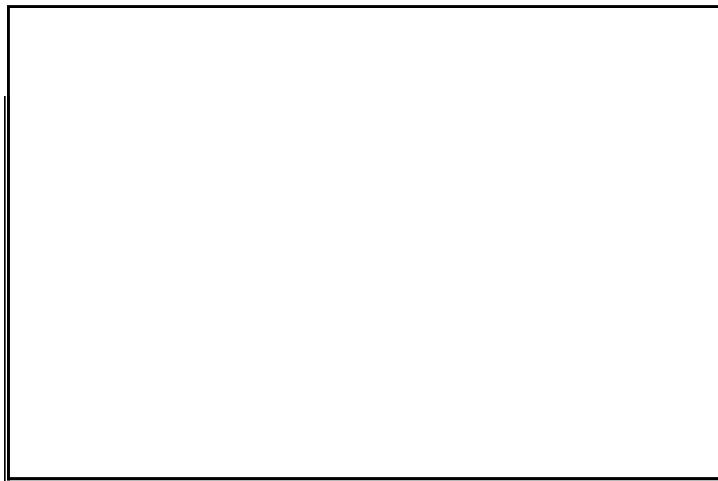


Donna Jones, ACS, assists a guest at the Carlisle Barracks county fair.
