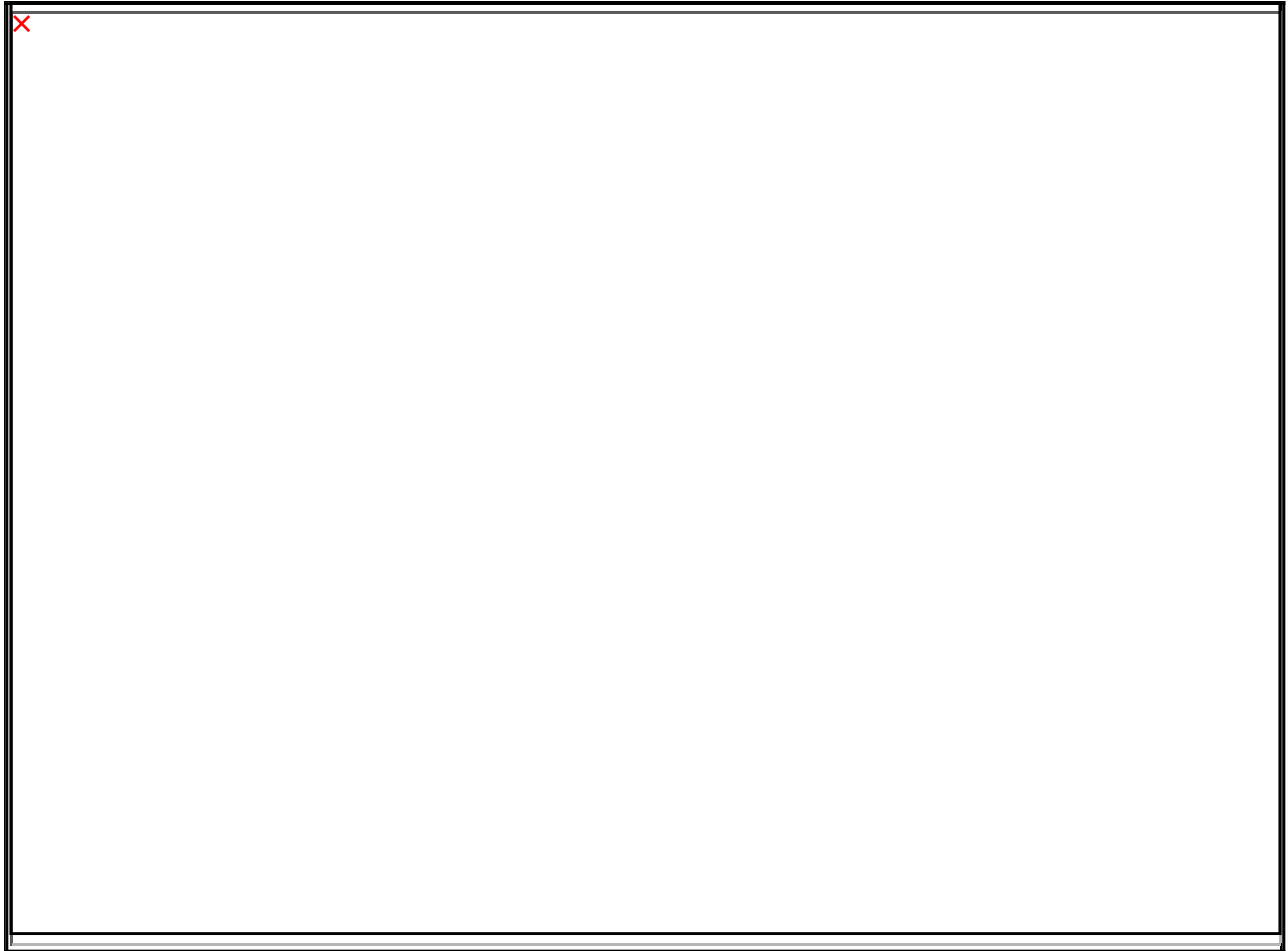


Civil-Military Relations is magnet topic for Harvard, Tufts events

Army War College's 18 Boston-area Fellows join fellow students, faculty

BOSTON, Mass. -- Harvard and Tufts hosted the Army War College's senior leader for several presentations and



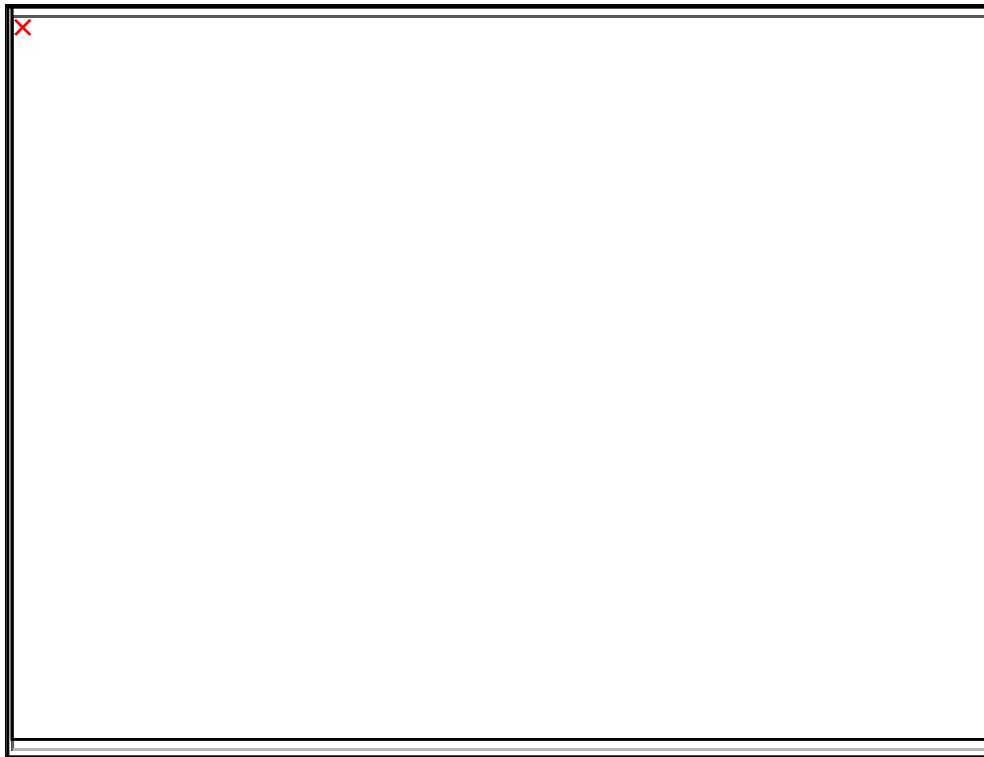
dialogue sessions about Civil-Military Relations, October 6.

Maj. Gen. Bill Rapp spoke to faculty and students at the Harvard Faculty Club, drawing on multiple experiences to include his tenure as the Army's Chief of Legislative Liaison, prior to becoming commandant of the US Army War College in Summer 2014.

The Harvard Weatherhead Center sponsored the event which included the nine Army War College Fellows studying at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. These USAWC Fellows will complete a year of study, research, and publishing in lieu of attendance at one of the nation's War Colleges; they will be credited for senior service level education.

In a second event, Rapp addressed faculty and students invited by the Tufts University Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. Rapp's discussion of civil-military relations addressed the sensitive and important subject of military leaders responsibility to give Best Military Advice to US civilian leaders.



In addition to the Fellows at Harvard, there are four USAWC Fellows at Tufts, and five at MIT's Lincoln Lab & Security Studies/ Security Studies Program/ Center fo Transportation and Logistics. Rapp met with hosting faculty and senior administrators at these schools, the Harvard Business School and Harvard Belfer Center.

Rapp also visited with the USAWC Fellows at each of the Boston locations where they are learning this year: Harvard; MIT; and Tufts; and conducted office calls with their hosting faculty and senior administrators, plus at Harvard Business School and Harvard Belfer Center.

The 18 Boston-area Fellows are among 88 USAWC Fellows studying in 48 fellowship programs across the United States and abroad. The all-component program includes 73 active duty Army officers, 8 Army National Guard and 7 Army Reserve officers.
