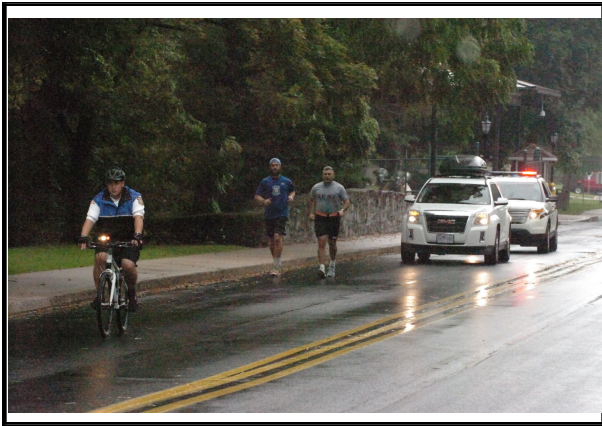


Military community salutes heart and soles invested in cross-country run for wounded warriors
