Violent incidents in Canada, US act as reminders: Individual precautions + post security measures

Oct. 24, 2014 -- Within days, Americans have learned of violent attacks at the Canadian Parliament and in New York City, a breach of White House fenceline, and others. There are no known connections among these incidents. There are no known connections to foreign terrorist groups. However, these attacks are a reminder of a range of possibilities, from crime to seemingly random attacks to terrorism.

For any possible threats, the installation reviews security options regularly – and so should every one.

The *Carlisle Barracks Emergency Services* does not signal its security posture: it does use a range of routine, random, and special measures for the safety and security of the military community, to include coordination with law enforcement partners in neighboring communities.

Every individual can refresh prudent precautions for themselves and family members --

- Be vigilant ... be aware of your surroundings
- Be watchful ... report suspicious activity with the iWatch link on the website (www.carlisle.army.mil) or call 911
- Lock vehicles routinely, check for tampering
- Protect your personal presence online, to include but not only Facebook; start a family conversation --
- Make no comment about family/friends' deployments
- Check your privacy settings on FB
- Include no personally identifying information, e.g., home address in publicly accessible pages
- Be wary of posting personal information on the web
