

Dec. 5 declared National Day of Mourning, most post activities closed

As of 0900 4 Dec- Former President George Bush, the 41st President of the United States, passed away at the age of 94 on November 30th. President Trump, in response to this tragic event, issued an executive order to close federal offices and excuse all federal employees from duty to honor the passing of the former President.

All USAWC staff and faculty, and USAG employees, unless emergency essential or scheduling conflicts are identified, will cease non-mission essential operations on 05 December 2018.

Residents are advised that on Dec. 6 there will be 21 rounds fired from the cannon near Indian Field at noon and 50 rounds fired at retreat as part of the salute to President Bush.

- Army War College classes are cancelled, however the Nominative Leader Course and Basic Strategic Arts Program will continue as scheduled.
- The Army Heritage and Education Center will be closed.
- The Commissary and Exchange will be open.

- Dunham Clinic will be open for patient care and all services (including Pharmacy) from 7:30 until 11:30 a.m. on 5 December. The clinic will be closed after 11:30 a.m. All patients with appointments after 11:30 a.m. will be contacted to be rescheduled for the morning of 5 December.
- All CDC/CYS activities, to include after-school care are closed.
- The Root Hall Deli, Cafe Cumberland, Golf Course Snack Bar and Pershing Tavern are closed.
- The Thorpe Fitness Center will be open 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the Root Hall Gym and Indian Field Fitness Center will be closed.
- Leisure Travel Services and Barracks Crossings will be closed.
- The golf course pro shop will be open 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.
- The bowling alley will be open for league play only from 5-9 p.m.
- FTIG Community Club will be open for troop feedings only
