Women's Journey through History." The event will be streamed live on ZOOM and is restricted to the first 500 registrants.

In this staged reading, high school student Melanie must write about the most influential woman in history - the play provides her with an entertaining and quick tour through that journey, starting with the struggle women had in the 17th century Puritan Revolution through to our 21st century empowered women politicians.
