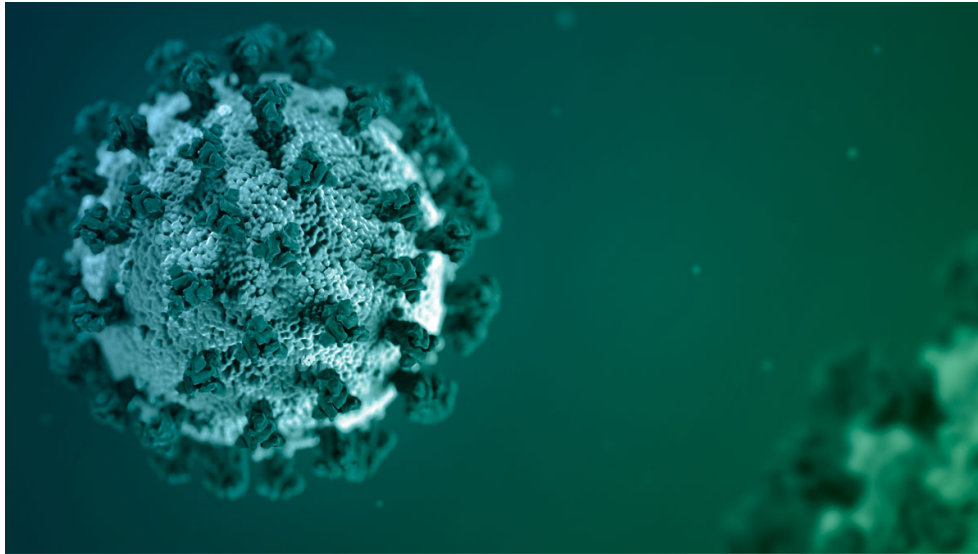


Mask policy modified for Fully Vaccinated; Appointment site **HERE** for Moderna COVID vaccine June 2

MAY 26, 2021 -- Carlisle Barracks is at Health Protection Condition HBCon BRAVO (as of Apr 19)

Fully vaccinated individuals or those recovered from clinically diagnosed COVID-19 in the last 90 days are not required to ROM based on travel. If they are exhibiting any COVID-19 symptoms a ROM is required until cleared by a healthcare provider.

Individuals not fully vaccinated are required to ROM if traveling from a restricted travel location or from outside of the United States and its territories.

For students/families headed to Korea: PCR testing is Friday 18 June, noon to 1 pm, at Dunham. You'll get result Sat, 19 June, starting the clock for meeting S. Korean requirements for current tests.

HPCON
Health Protection Condition Levels
Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Department of Defense Public Health Emergency Management policy assigns health protection condition (HPCON) levels to disease outbreaks, such as the spread of COVID-19, based on the severity of the disease and the level of transmission occurring in the local community.

HPCON levels outline specific actions you can take in response to a health threat. While it's always important to prevent the spread of germs, there are additional steps you can take if COVID-19 transmission becomes more widespread in your community. Regardless of the current HPCON level, always follow the guidance from your installation and local public health agencies.

Take the following actions to protect the health and safety of your family and your community.

0 ROUTINE
No community transmission

Take everyday actions to stop the spread of germs:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Wash your hands often and for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- Cover your cough/sneeze with a tissue, then throw it in the trash; cough/sneeze into your elbow if tissues are unavailable.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Ensure all immunizations are up to date, including your seasonal flu shot.
- Stay home if you are sick, and avoid close contact with family members and pets.
- Create an emergency preparedness kit.

ALPHA LIMITED
Community transmission beginning

Continue all previous actions and:

- Routinely clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- If you are sick, call your medical provider for instructions on receiving care before going to the clinic.
- Stay informed by routinely checking reliable sources of information such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and your local public health agencies.

BRAVO MODERATE
Increased community transmission

Continue all previous actions and:

- Avoid unnecessary contact with others, such as shaking hands and hugging.
- Avoid unnecessary travel, especially to areas known to be experiencing active disease transmission.
- Ensure supplies of food, medication, and other items needed for babies and pets are available to last at least 14 days.
- Prepare for travel restrictions and cancellation of public gatherings, such as school, religious, and other community activities; make alternative arrangements for childcare.
- Observe local guidance on movement restrictions and access requirements for military installations.
- Seek guidance from employers and unit leaders about changes to work practices (e.g., telework) and training events.
- Comply with medical orders for self-isolation or quarantine.

CHARLIE SUBSTANTIAL
Sustained community transmission

Continue taking all previous actions and:

- Expect cancellation of in-person gatherings (e.g., schools, daycare, all community activities) and restricted ability to travel.
- Plan activities for family members, especially children, in case you are restricted to your home for prolonged periods of time.
- Prepare for the potential of limited access to supplies and services, including severely restricted access to military installations.
- Implement remote work procedures as directed by your employer.

Effective immediately, I am modifying the current barracks mask policy for fully vaccinated persons indoors and outdoors. **Fully vaccinated** means 2 doses + 2 weeks for Moderna and Pfizer vaccines, or 1 Johnson & Johnson dose + 2 weeks.

"Fully vaccinated employees, faculty, students, family members and visitors are no longer required to wear a mask indoors or outdoors on the installation and its facilities, with limited exceptions for the Child Development Center, Dunham Army Health Clinic, and the Carlisle Barracks Dental Clinic. The Exchange will make an independent announcement. In the Commissary, fully vaccinated visitors are no longer required to wear masks.

"This mask policy modification emphasizes individual responsibility and personal risk assessment. Those personnel who are not fully vaccinated will continue to wear masks unless alone in a room indoors, or outdoors with 6-feet distancing. Further, all may choose to wear a mask, as preferred.

"This policy decision does not fully rescind the mask policy which will remain tied to regular conditions checks and risk assessment as we move through the transition to a more fully vaccinated or herd-immune population. The modified mask policy follows DoD policy, based on updated guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

"These COVID-19-related policies remain in place at Carlisle Barracks: social distancing, facility occupancy caps, remaining at home when sick, and telework as authorized by supervisor.

"Fully vaccinated people will still have to wear a mask on public transit, including planes, trains, buses, and transport hubs such as airports and stations until policy expiration, Sep. 13 or when modified.

"As we approach the end of Academic Year 21 and prepare to welcome distance education students this summer for the Second Resident Course followed by the Class of 22, **I encourage everyone to get vaccinated** to protect the force and keep us on a positive trajectory in the War College and across our community."

HPCon Bravo = more services opening & easing restrictions (scroll below), and telework shift: See the graphic on this page for details about Health Protection Condition BRAVO. At Carlisle Barracks, the key change will be to shift away from the "maximum telework." Contact your supervisor

DELTA SEVERE


Widespread community transmission

Continue taking all previous actions and:


- Expect to remain at home for extended periods of time as movement in the community may be restricted, and at-home isolation or quarantine may be directed.
- Follow all directives and guidance from local, state and Federal authorities; these actions are to protect the health and safety of you and your Family.

COVID VACCINATION – CURRENT STATUS

The May 18 Commanders' town hall took a positive tone, as Maj. Gen. David Hill, the acting commandant, reflected on the work and commitment to safety that has allowed conditions to improve at Carlisle Barracks. He addressed the two major changes: the move to HPCON Bravo and the updated mask policy for all fully vaccinated individuals. Hill reiterated that USAWC respects a fully vaccinated person's decision to continue wearing a mask. He encouraged those who have not gotten vaccinated to do so.

Col. Short, Garrison commander, addressed the increased capacity to 75% for YS summer camp and CDC. Those participating in youth sports must continue to wear masks and social distance while playing their sport. Col. Saenz, Dunham Health Clinic commander, reminded people that mass vaccination clinics will be held through June. If you got your vaccine somewhere other than Dunham, take your COVID vaccine card to the Immunizations Clinic or update your records through the TRICARE Secure Messaging System. At this time only Pfizer is approved for teens. Dunham does not have storage capability for Pfizer. Go to [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) (linked to the right) to find Pfizer vaccine clinic.

- COVID Vaccinations opened April 14 to all TRICARE beneficiaries and DOD employees
- Dunham Clinic's COVID Vaccination clinics administer MODERNA vaccine – authorized for 18-and-older, only.
- Find Pfizer appointments at vaccinefinder.org which offers 3 way to search: by vaccine type, by zip code, by distance to the shot location. Pfizer vaccine's emergency use authorization extends to 16-and-older.
- **Appointments are open now, see chart on the right hand side for dates, times, and locations.**
- **Insider Tip:** To make sure no vaccine vial goes to waste extra vaccines may be available at the end of each clinic. Be there as close to the last scheduled appointment for you opportunity to get the vaccine.

- Moderna is a two-dose vaccination series. The 2nd dose should be no earlier than 24 days after the 1st dose, and no later than 6 weeks after the 1st dose. This expanded window for 2nd doses is a change from the original guidance (formerly 4 weeks, plus/minus 4 days).

PENNSYLVANIA COVID-19 CONDITIONS

Pa. cases as of June 7, 2021 - Overall, PA cases are going down, and Cumberland County has gone from "very high risk" to "high risk." However, the risk has not gone away completely.

Pennsylvania 61% decrease in the 14-day trend. Cumberland County is at High Risk with a 25% decrease in the 14-day trend.

Current report of comparable incident levels--6 cases per 100,000 people for Cumberland county, 6 per 100K in Franklin County, 5 per 100K in Huntingdon County--and Pennsylvania-wide, 4 per 100K.

*Cumberland County is at a high risk because if the daily case rate dropped to less than about 11.4 cases per 100,000 people and the test positivity stays low.
