Armenian Defense Ministry delegation visits the Army War College

The Armenian Ministry of Defense visited the Army War College on Sep. 21 as part of NATO's Defense Education Enhancement Program.

A delegation of six senior educators from the Armenian Training and Education Centers visited the War College to gain an understanding on how the USAWC receives policy from Joint and Army Staff and creates senior service level curriculum from that guidance.

"There is nothing more important than contributing to our Nation's national security," said Matthew Gooding, USAWC Associate Provost. "By committing our time and resources to help improve the military education of NATO's DEEP partners worldwide," he said.
